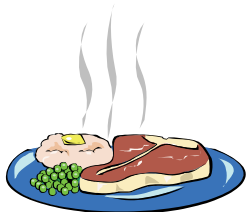

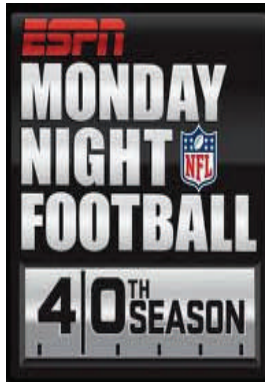

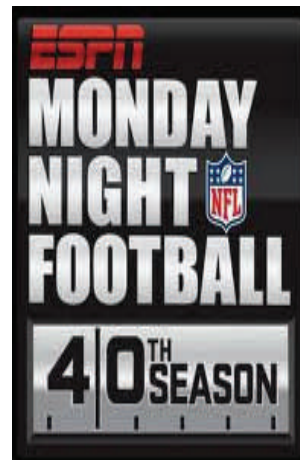

Was a great success. We raised \$250 for our food basket program. Thanks to all.

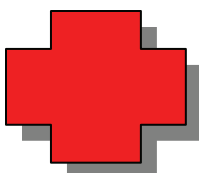
KNIGHTS OF THE MONTH
