All old used cell phones in any condition will be appreciated. Thanks from our troops over seas for the free phone time.



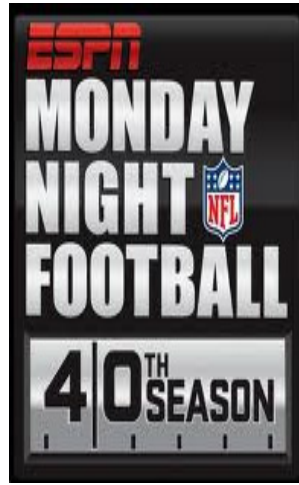
